Let's Move! Cities, Towns and Counties (LMCTC)

- LMCTC is a key part of First Lady Michelle Obama's Let's Move! Campaign.
 - Initiative was enhanced in July 2012
- NLC is working in partnership with HHS, and with the support of USDA, NACo and other nonprofit organizations.
- To date, over 360 cities, towns and counties participating have been awarded nearly 1,100 medals.

Five goals were established for cities, towns and counties participating in LMCTC:

- These goals:
 - Build upon existing resources and activities
 - Are achievable and measurable
 - Promote sustainable strategies
 - Provide uniformity across the country
 - Help inform our technical assistance



Let's Move! Cities, Towns and Counties - Goals

Goal I: Start Early, Start Smart

 Helping early care and education providers incorporate best practices for nutrition, physical activity and screen time into their programs.

Goal II: MyPlate, Your Place

 Prominently displaying MyPlate in all municipallyor county- owned or operated venues where food is offered or sold.



Goal III: Smart Servings for Students

Increasing participation in school breakfast and lunch programs.



Let's Move! Cities, Towns and Counties – Goals Continued

Goal IV: Model Food Service

 Implementing healthy and sustainable food service guidelines that are aligned with the *Dietary Guidelines for Americans* at municipally- or county- owned or operated venues that serve food.

Goal V: Active Kids at Play


 Mapping local playspaces, completing a needs assessment, developing an action plan, and implementing a minimum of three proven policies, programs or initiatives aimed at increasing access to play.





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Process Chart



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Step 1: Assess Starting Point with Medal Status Survey

The medal status survey is your first step after signing up for LMCTC.

- Allows you to assess your progress to date on the five LMCTC goals.
- Many LMCTC sites have already completed some work on the five goals.
- Helps you identify next steps for action and areas where technical assistance might be needed.
- Work with local partners on taking action.

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
Step 2: Receive Medals from NLC

Your survey responses let us know what progress you have made on the LMCTC goals.

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Process Chart



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
Step 2: Receive Medals from NLC

- NLC awards bronze, silver, and gold medal certificates at the end of each month.
- The deadline for each month's medal awarding is usually a few days before the end of the month. Special celebratory session in Nov.
- Medals appear on your community profile page and rank changes on the medal standings page.

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Step 3: Celebrate success!

- Use NLC's local press release template to generate media coverage.
- Use city platform to share the news.
- Add content to your community profile page!
 - Content is reviewed and posted in 24-48 hours.
 - Gives us a better idea of the full extent of your activities.
 - Opens the door for additional recognition/spotlight opportunities.




Step 3: Celebrate success!

Adding content to your community profile page:



- Once you complete the medal status survey, sent your access code (the code at end of survey link).
- Scroll down to bottom right and enter your code where it says, "Are you the local elected official? Click here to update your page."
- Templates available.



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Process Chart




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Using the resources mentioned, staff, and technical assistance opportunities, continue to take action on the rest of the LCMTC Goals.



LAKEWOOD, CO

Occupying 45-square miles and with a population of 143,000, Lakewood is the third largest city in the Denver metro area. One guarter of the land is dedicated to parks. open space and trails, and the City has several major employment centers. Residents are served by the Jefferson County Public School District and a number of partnerships exist between the two entities. A sampling of the City's facilities include 4 recreation centers, 58 playgrounds, 56 neighborhood parks, 195 miles of bike trails, 7 regional parks, 36 tennis courts, 4 Head Start facilities and 2 additional preschools.

MEDALS ACTIVITY (RANK 6)



GOAL I: START EARLY, START SMART Critical to Our Success:

Promoting and prioritizing Early Childhood Education is a priority in Lakewood. Lakewood's Family Services Division is an active participant in the Early Childhood Council and is an active partner with Childcare Innovations, Jefferson County's resource and referral agency. Unique programs we offer include hands on activities for children and families to grow and prepare nutritious food together.

Next Steps:

Next steps include integrating the principles of LMCTC in every day activities with children and their families and sharing this information with our local partners and collaborators.

GOAL II: MYPLATE, YOUR PLACE Critical to Our Success:

The City of Lakewood is a partner with USDA for Choose MyPlate. The MyPlate graphic illustrating a balanced approach to proper nutrition can be seen at most of the City's facilities that serve food.

Next Steps:

Our goal is to create a flier to send home with kids on their first day of camp, giving suggestions for how to pack a healthy sack lunch. On the other side of the flier we will print MyPlate!

GOAL III: SMART SERVINGS FOR STUDENTS Critical to Our Success:

Lakewood students are served by Jefferson County Public Schools where school meals include a variety of fruits, vegetables, lean protein, low fat dairy and whole grain items. Students choose between 1% and fat free milk, are served at least 1/2 cup of fruit and/or vegetables at every meal, enjoy meals rich with dark greens, red/orange and starchy vegetables and beans and whole grain products.

Next Steps:

Continue to help encourage and support healthy choices at home by serving


